What did it take to end up with 152 geraniums in church for our Pentecost celebration? Beyond those who grew and sold us the plants, it took a lot of work from a number of members. Orders were taken and kept track of by Kathy Lueck. Kathy and Jean Cook, as members of Altar Guild, spent over an hour placing the geraniums in the church and fellowship hall. Mark and Terri Lammert spent hours watering the plants on Saturday. Any project like this only works when members support the idea and a number of people then do the work to make it possible.

At the first Pentecost, God empowered the disciples to speak in languages that they were miraculously given to use. But then the disciples needed to actually *use* them, overcoming the criticism and the persecution that followed. Later in history, Christians needed to support mission activities abroad and in their communities, and prepare the next generation through Christian education, while still overcoming criticism and persecution.

This Pentecost reminds us that the church continues when God blesses His people and then His people use those blessings to His glory.

A note from the Church Council regarding gifts and donations

Gifts further the Lord's work through the ministry of St Mark Lutheran Church. The congregation, through the work of its Boards and the Church Council identifies and authorizes initiatives and activities in agreement with the purpose of St Mark. Funds are established to receive gifts and donations for these initiatives.

Gifts to the General Fund and Building Fund support all planned and budgeted activities of St Mark and provide the most flexibility for the congregation to address the greatest needs.

Gifts to designated funds support an identified initiative or activity the congregation has undertaken. Examples are the Adopt a Student and International Missions programs. Should gifts to a designated fund exceed the need or should the activity or initiative be concluded, the Church Council directs any excess funds to the area of greatest need.

Special Gifts and Donations are gifts offered to St Mark that fall outside of the scope of the congregation's established funds or initiatives. St Mark welcomes gifts that are consistent with its purpose. Members considering a special gift or donation to St Mark are asked to discuss this with pastor or an elder in advance.

Members considering a gift to St Mark that is designated for a particular social services organization are asked to consider offering such gifts directly to the organization. Direct donations will get to the organization more quickly and donating directly will save St Mark administrative costs to manage these funds. St Mark has established accounts for the Food Pantry, NATH Shelter and Domestic Violence Center. Members wishing to provide gifts to any other social service organizations are asked to make those gifts directly to that organization.

Did You Know...

You as an individual can invest your money through the Lutheran Church Extension Fund? Yes, investing is also open to congregation members and at this time they have a 4.5% on a 6-month Rate Term Note, minimum \$500 investment or a 5% 18-month fixed rate Term Note, minimum \$500 investment. That is a great rate. You will find an attached sheet that you can use to look over this opportunity. You can use this sheet to start your investment today.
